Making your Own Site

Things to Do When Creating a Web Site

- Think about your Audience. Who will be accessing the site? What will make the site unique? Think about what you like to see in a web site.
- **Draw a Comp.** A comp is a quick drawing of what one page of your web site is going to look like when it is finished. Good web sites normally repeat parts of the comp throughout the web site design to give the whole site a unique look which identifies the site.
- Collect materials. It is best to collect materials ahead of time. Scan in pictures in .jpg, .gif or .png format in a web-friendly size and at 72 ppi or less. Have textual elements available in standard text files. Put everything in one folder.
- **Start Creating.** A minimum web site can just be a couple of pages. Leave room for development but avoid "construction" signs.
